Kiss and Drive users will be given a major 'shake up' next week. As of Monday 5th September, we will be placing yellow witches hats in the kiss and drive to block it off to people arriving early. The witches hats will be removed a few minutes after the siren has gone.

Parents will be encouraged to leave home later and if they arrive too early, they will not be allowed to form a queue in Patrick Way and will be made to drive around the block until the siren has gone. 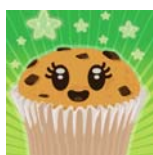


## Committee News
